Progress summary

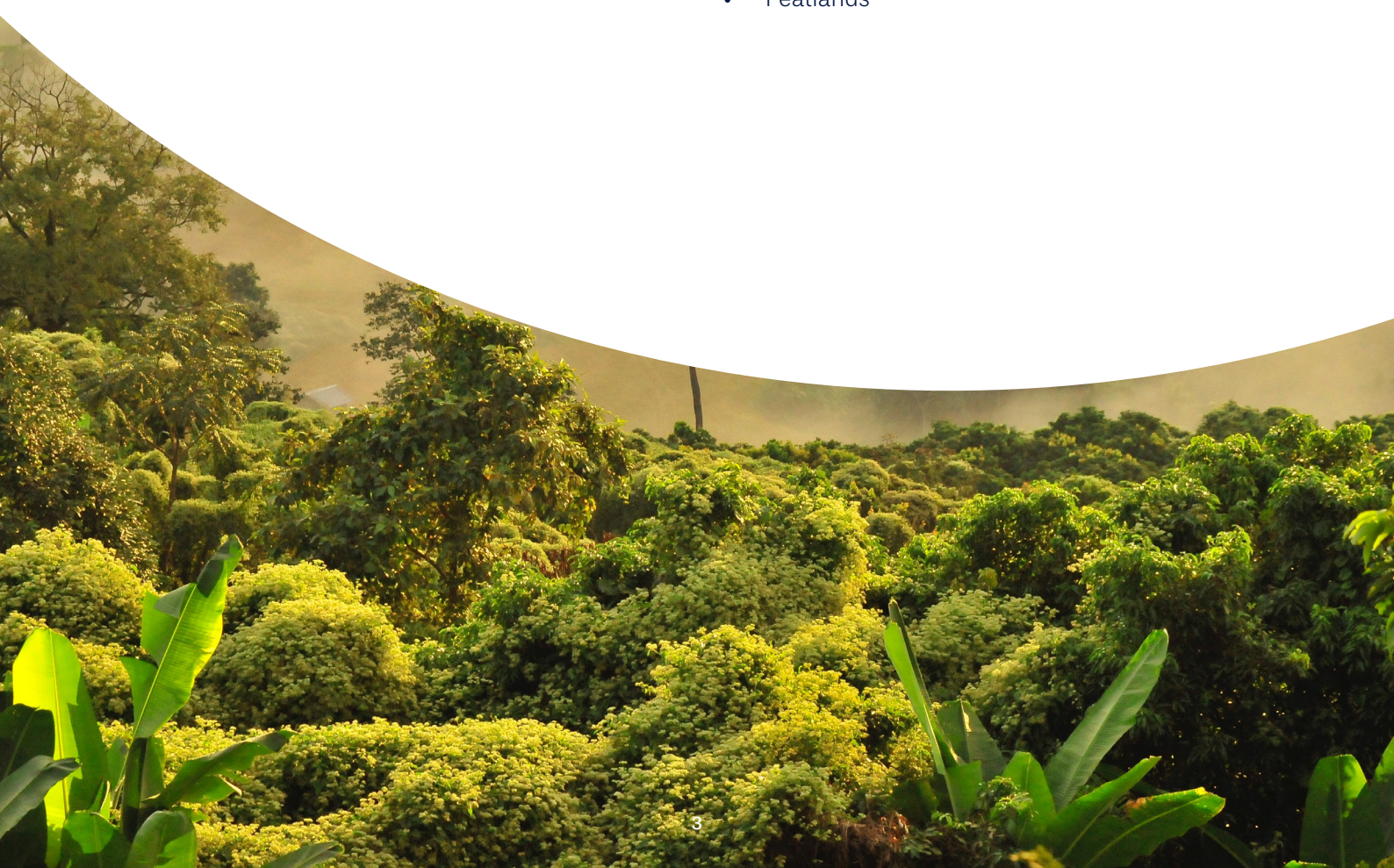
Brambles has partnered with two key implementation partners and started on the afforestation and reforestation journey. Currently, Brambles has an on-the-ground footprint with Tree-Nation in various countries, and with WeForest in Zambia, based at Mafinga Hills.

We have a mixture of area under restoration and trees planted/allowed to sustainably grow. The Mafinga Hills project is a mixture of wet, dry and hill miombo, Afromontane and riparian forests and montane grasslands which is considered rare in Zambia.

Brambles works with implementation partners and receives reporting from them. Brambles currently works with Tree-Nation and WeForest (Mafinga Hills).

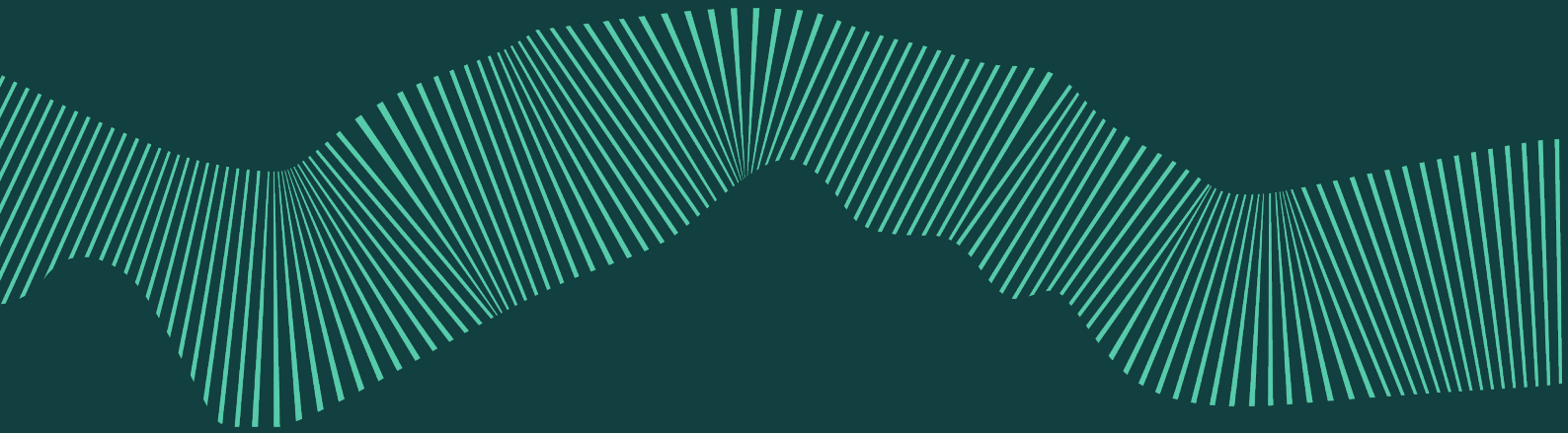
